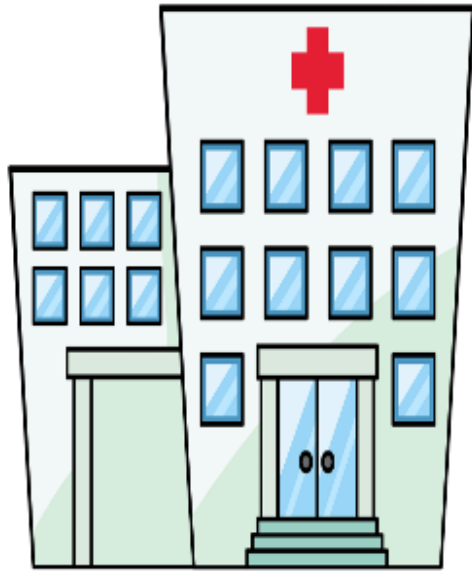

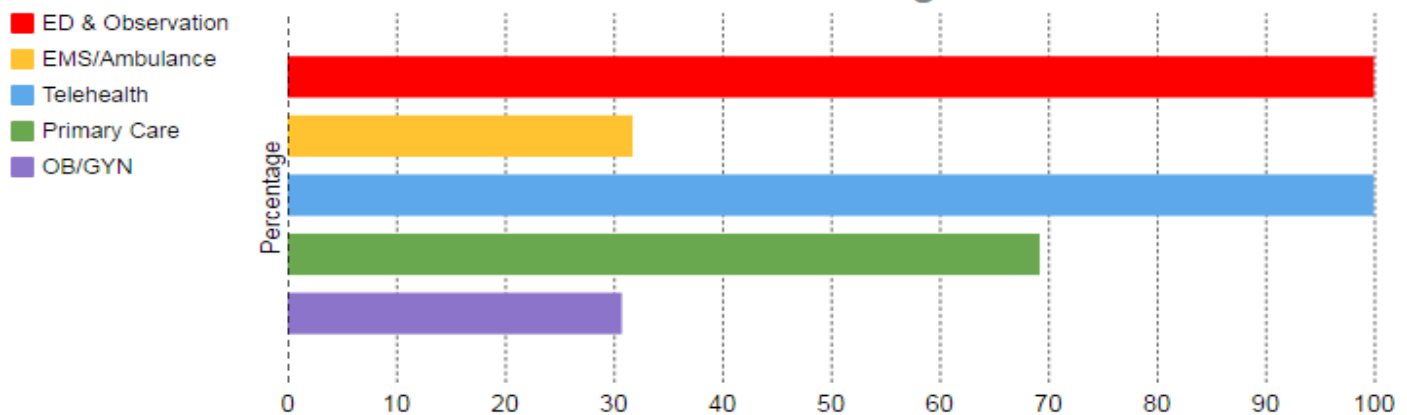

Critical Access Hospital (CAH)

Critical Access Hospitals (CAHs) are certified and structured under a different set of Medicare Conditions of Participation than acute care hospitals. They have a limited size (no more than 25 inpatient beds), short lengths of stays (annual average length of stay of no more than 96 hours for acute inpatient care) and meet certain location and distance requirements. CAHs also provide outpatient care and offer 24/7 emergency care. They receive cost-based reimbursement from Medicare, instead of fee-for-service or fixed reimbursement rates. All NRHP member hospitals are federally certified as CAHs.

Swing Beds

The Social Security Act permits certain small, rural hospitals to enter into a swing bed agreement, under which the hospital can use its beds, as needed, to provide either acute or skilled nursing facility (SNF) care. Swing bed facilities must be incorporated into the SNF prospective payment system (PPS); however, CAHs with swing beds are exempt from the SNF PPS and are paid by Medicare at cost. To qualify for SNF-level services, a beneficiary is required to receive acute care as a hospital inpatient for a medically necessary stay of at least three consecutive calendar days. Eleven of 13 NRHP member hospitals utilize swing beds.

Long Term Care Nursing Facility (SN/IC)

Nursing facilities are defined in the Nevada Revised Statutes as facilities which may provide skilled and/or intermediate/custodial (IC) care. A hospital based, or distinct-part, skilled nursing facility (SNF) shares a common building with a publicly owned hospital or a hospital located in a county with a population of 100,000 or less. Under Medicare, skilled care is reimbursed under SNF PPS, and IC care is not a covered benefit. Under Nevada Medicaid, skilled and IC care are reimbursed under Medicare reasonable cost principles, including the routine cost limitation (RCL), and the lesser of cost or charges (LCC). Seven of 13 NRHP member hospitals have a distinct-part SNF.

Rural Health Clinic (RHC)

Rural Health Clinics (RHCs) are federally qualified to receive Medicare and Nevada Medicaid reimbursement at cost. An RHC must be located in a rural area and have a geographic or population health professional shortage area (HPSA) designation, or a Governor's shortage area designation. An RHC must have an advance practice registered nurse (APRN) or physician assistant (PA) onsite to see patients 50% of the time that the clinic is open, and is required to provide outpatient primary care and basic laboratory services. Eight of 13 NRHP members hospital operate one or more RHCs.

Building on a long history of cooperation dating from the mid 1970's, Nevada's frontier, small and rural hospitals realized they are much stronger standing together than as isolated, unaffiliated entities. In 1987, with temporary funding from The Robert Wood Johnson Foundation's "Hospital Based Rural Healthcare Program," the group established a formal consortium, Nevada Rural Hospital Project (now Partners), intended to focus on solutions to the issues and challenges facing rural hospitals. Now 30 years old, NRHP members and staff can point with pride to a long list of accomplishments.

PURPOSE

NRHP's purpose is to maintain access to hospital-based healthcare services in rural settings.

MISSION

NRHP's mission is to improve the viability of member hospitals through shared services, resources and advocacy.

MEMBERSHIP AND FOCUS

NRHP membership includes thirteen of Nevada's fourteen small and rural hospitals. Regular Members are public and private not-for-profit facilities. For-profit hospitals belong as Associate Members of the NRHP Foundation. Each Regular Member is represented with an equal vote on the NRHP Board. NRHP is staffed by eight full-time equivalents and operates from its office in Reno, Nevada. Funded by dues, grants, and fee-for-service programs, activities are organized to address the five key components of hospital viability listed below.

PROGRAMS AND ACTIVITIES THAT SHAPE AND INTERPRET THE MEMBERS' OPERATING ENVIRONMENT

- Advocate at the regulatory and legislative levels for rural hospitals
- Develop and maintain collaborative and productive relationships with other organizations in order to create resources and develop solutions for the members
- Verify and disseminate information
- Protect and maintain NRHP as a valued resource for members

PROGRAMS AND ACTIVITIES THAT SUPPORT MEMBER FINANCIAL VIABILITY

- Maintain, administer, and grow the NRHP Revolving Loan Pool and the Rural Healthcare Provider (RHP) Loan Pool
- Obtain grants that support the NRHP mission and advance members' missions
- Provide centralized financial expertise
- Provide data to support member decision-making

- Educate members' business/financial staffs and boards about hospital finance and operations
- Support members through the Flex and SHIP programs' Financial and Quality Performance Improvement initiatives
- Reduce member cost
 - Administer member employee health insurance program
 - Administer the TEAM program (self-funded biomedical and communication equipment maintenance program)
 - Administer the members' professional liability insurance pool (LiCON)
 - Administer a group purchasing program for participating members
 - Administer Reference Lab group rate
 - Administer Mobile MRI program for participating members
 - Administer property insurance program
 - Administer worker's compensation insurance program

PROGRAMS AND ACTIVITIES THAT ENHANCE THE AVAILABILITY AND QUALITY OF MEMBERS' HUMAN RESOURCES

- Promote workforce development
- Provide Board education to members
- Administer a Human Resources Work Group

PROGRAMS AND ACTIVITIES THAT SUPPORT AN APPROPRIATE ARRAY OF HIGH QUALITY SERVICES IN MEMBER COMMUNITIES

- Support teleradiology services in member hospitals
- Support expansion of telehealth capability
- Support performance improvement, quality assurance, and patient safety
- Support Nevada Flex and SHIP programs
- Administer the Risk Manager Work Group, Infection Control Work Group, and Nevada Rural Hospital QI Network, Electronic Health Records (EHR) Work Group

PROGRAMS AND ACTIVITIES THAT SUPPORT ADEQUATE FACILITIES AND TECHNOLOGY IN MEMBER FACILITIES AND AT THE NRHP OFFICE

- Provide centralized information technology expertise to enhance member connectivity, functionality, and decision making
- Provide member education re: technology, federal, and local initiatives, etc.
- Manage the NRHP centralized telemedicine archive
- Support NRHP hosted applications, including shared, and member specific applications
- Support members' IT staff in daily operations, and problem resolution
- Support WAN broadband capacity, network security, and disaster recovery
