

Expanding COVID-19 Response in Rural Communities through Rural Health Clinics

To expand access to vaccines and ensure equity in COVID-19 response in rural communities, the Health Resources and Services Administration is working with Rural Health Clinics (RHCs) across the nation to strengthen vaccine allocation and confidence, and to expand COVID-19 testing and mitigation.

RHCs are a special certification given to health care practices in underserved rural areas by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS). More than 4,600 Rural Health Clinics (RHCs) in 45 states make up a key part of the rural health care infrastructure and help address health equity gaps in medically underserved rural communities to improve health outcomes for rural residents.

Rural Health Clinic (RHC) COVID-19 Programs

In response to the coronavirus pandemic, three new programs are available to help RHCs meet community needs and improve rural health care services:

I didn't receive my COVID-19 Testing and Mitigation Funding (\$100,000 per RHC) – What should I do?



- Be compliant and up-to-date on <u>RHCcovidreporting.com</u> as of April 18, 2021
- Certified and listed on QCOR as RHC before April 18, 2021
 - Email rhccovidreporting@narhc.org or rhctestinginfo@nosorh.org with your TIN and CCN if you still believe you should have received funding. Any explanation you can offer will also help such as:
 - Did you receive testing funds last year?
 - Did you receive some funding but not for all your RHCs?
 - We will investigate the issue



What are the reporting requirements for RHCCTM Funding?



- RHCcovidreporting.com
- Report total test and positive test numbers MONTHLY until the end of the relevant funding timeline
 - If you received RHC COVID-19 Testing and Mitigation Funding you must report June 2021-December 2022 data.
 - If you received RHC COVID-19 Testing Funding ONLY you must report May 2020-December 2021 data.
 - If you received BOTH, you must report May 2020-December 2022 data.

- Report tests monthly




What is Mitigation? How can I use the RHCCTM Funding?

- Direct *remaining* expenses or indirect expenses related to:
 - Testing
 - Mitigation
 - Testing Related
 - Mitigation Related
- All things testing + efforts to prevent COVID-19 transmission
 - Case investigation, education, screening, digital technologies, post-COVID conditions management, retrofitting facilities to support testing and mitigation, and much more





Unallowable Expenses



- Direct provider-to-patient vaccine administration (shot-inarm)
- Expenses for which you are otherwise reimbursed (no double counting)



Insurance and Reimbursement

- You may apply funds to the remaining expenses or indirect costs attributable to COVID-19 testing, mitigation, and testing and mitigation related expenses, after netting the other funds received or obligated to be received which offset those expenses
 - You may use <u>any reasonable method</u> of estimating the expenses or indirect costs attributable not covered by other payments
 - You should maintain appropriate records and cost documentation to support these estimates
- You ARE NOT accountable for program income earned after the period of support



What is a "reasonable method?"



- Simplest form:
 - Total expenses related to COVID testing minus total reimbursement for COVID testing during the period of support.

- Resources:
 - Estimation Methods
 - Other Methods







- Can you provide some examples of maintaining healthy environments for mitigation examples?
 - Wipeable covers on electronics- Credit card machines, tablets, screens
 - Portable air cleaners, pleated air filters
 - HVAC system allows for more outdoor air circulation and operates properly.
 - Touchless sensors- toilets, sinks, doors, hand-dryers, water fountains, temperature screening
 - Use Disinfectant products that are from <u>About List N:</u>
 <u>Disinfectants for Coronavirus (COVID-19) | Coronavirus (COVID-19) | US EPA</u>
 - PPE Expenses- Gowns, gloves, Facemasks, etc.







- Can we replace or re-cover beds, chairs?
 Yes!! Re-covering worn, upholstered furniture is acceptable.
 If you have beds that have tears, rips or cracks then you will need to correct those issues as those are infection control concerns.
- Can we replace the carpet?
 - Yes
 - Carpeting is harder to keep clean, especially after spills of blood and body substances.

Can I buy a freezer/refrigerator ?YES!

Currently storage is under:

• Supplies to provide COVID-19 testing includes, but is not limited to:

Storage (e.g., refrigerator, freezer, temperature-controlled cabinet)





- Can we pay our staff retention payments?
 - Yes- Offering hiring bonuses and retention payments.

- DATA 2000 Waivers
- \$3k per clinician who received their DATA 2000 waiver in 2019 or after. Only about 650 payments will be made, first come, first serve


